## **I. STATEMENT OF PURPOSE**

## **II. Family Engagement DEVELOPING AND REVISING THE POLICY**

A.X. Benavides Advisory Committee consisting of campus parents, teachers, principal and community members developed the campus Parental Involvement Policy. A.X. Written notices in both languages will be sent to parents notifying them of the date and times of the meetings. Parent volunteers, parent trainers, and parent liaisons will also contact other parents by phone regarding the meetings. Volunteers who speak both English and Spanish will make all contacts.
